HOW WE DO IT

- Provide a centralized location for research and teaching, taking advantage of the Menorah Park campus
- Support research and teaching collaborations with in-house infrastructure such as grant writing, clinical supervision and coordination, and other services
- Collaborate with regional professional education institutions to develop specialization and certificate programs in various disciplines, ranging from medicine and its subspecialties to nursing; physical, occupational, and speech therapy; chaplaincy; facility-based long-term care; home care; hospice; and community-based social services
- Work towards establishing and maintaining a database for subject recruitment for research
- Sponsor educational forums for both professionals and the public
